Description of Activity:

Based on the personal projects developed during the young leadership academy(activity 16)Twelve thematic outreach events held in each district, brought together 50-60 young people, civil society organizations, journalists and economic actors, politicians, and parliamentarians from the chosen locality together.

The young leaders in close partnership with a local NGO organized the half day thematic sensibilisation events on topics of civil and human rights, democratic process, and role of political parties.

The 30 young leaders developed in groups 2-3 ideas for the outreach events, these events held In an interactive way to engage the local population of Jordan.

Description of the Initiatives:

- Irbid group launched the "**No begging initiative**" represented by the young activists Anoud Al-Hamoud, Mohammad Alyan, Ahmad Melhem and Tareq Abu Omar. Contributing to the reduction of the phenomenon of begging in Irbid, particularly during Ramadan,in the presence of Minister of Social Development deputy, Parliamentarians, Political parties leaders, and Media.

- Ajloun Group launched "**Political empowerment of women initiative**" represented by the young activists, Suhaib Rababah, Mohammad alQuda, samira al Smadi, under the patronage of H. E. MP Dr. Reda Hadad, parliamentarians and NGOs. After conducting three dialogue sessions in Ajloun and Kufranja, to develop amendments to some legislation laws that prevent women's empowerment and participation in the political life.
- Al Ramtha group launched the "**No begging initiative**" represented by the young activists Anoud Al-Hamoud, Mohammad Alyan, Ahmad Melhem and Tareq Abu Omar. Contributing to the reduction of the phenomenon of begging in Irbid, particularly during Ramadan, in the presence of H.E. Minister of Social Development, Parliamentarians, Political parties leaders, and Media.
- Altafila group Launched "**My right to know**" initiative represented by the young activists Mohammad Aljaradin, Yazan Al Shabatat, Hamaeh AlKataba, enhancing school students in the democratic empowerment, and the Voluntary work.
- Madaba group launched "**The most beautiful neighborhood**" Initiative carried out several meetings hygiene campaigns in several districts of the city of Madaba with coordination between the local community and the Municipality of Greater Madaba. These meetings resulted in recommendations that will maintain the cleanliness and promote cultural behaviors among citizens.
- Ma'an group launched "**Participate your fingerprint makes the difference**" represented by the activists Majad AlRadawneh, and Rawan al shawbheh, the initiative discussed the constructive participation of young people in public life, in the presence of, Parliamentarians, Political parties leaders, and Media, which is the key element for the success of democratic transitions. Stressing on the Young people role in advancing the democracy wheels.
- Al Karak group launched "**Sahsah health initiative pthemna**" represented by the young activists Taqwa Alathamin, Majd Alrawashdeh, Malek Alkatatneh, In collaboration with the youth of Karak Directorate, targeted students, parents, and many of the competent authorities, talking about the social, health and economic problems caused by drug abuse and the spread of this scourge among members of society, especially in the student community.
- Amman group launched "**give me pavement**" initiative represented by Kitam Abu Anez, and Noor AlRawashdeh, the initiative aims to create a safe sidewalk for the ordinary citizens and the disabled.
- Al Mafraq group launched "**Unconscious Oh my heart**" initiative for the fight against drugs in Mafraq initiative represented by activists Rasha Rashid, Ibrahim Al Qadi, Abdel Rahman shidefat under the patronage of deputy governor Abdulla Abu Dalbough, raising mayors, dignitaries, tribal leaders, managers of education and preachers of mosques awareness on drugs and their effects on students.
- Jarash Group launched "**Underage marriage**" initiative presentation represented by Maryam Atmeh, and Mohammad Al qiyam on The results of the initiative, the meeting included many civil societies, schools, Associations, political parties, social institutions and the risks resulting from the underage marriage.

- Aqaba group launched the “ **Smile instead of a bullet**” represented by the young activists Ibrahim al Marafi, Salah Maraiya in the presence of Deputy Aqaba Governor, politician, Parliamentarian, and Media discussing the fire shoot phenomenon in the wedding, and the agony left for a lot of families that are still suffering to this day due to the injuries.
- Salt Group Launched “ **Don’t kill my Joy**” represented by the young activists Ahmad Abu Rumman, Anoud Al Hmoud in the presence of H.E Mohammed hamaida, police chief, Politician, Parliamentarian, and Media discussing the fire shoot phenomenon in the wedding, and the agony left for a lot of families that are still suffering to this day due to the injuries.

Challenges and Modifications:

The 2 participants from Zarqa submitted the idea /title of the initiative and work plan to JCCE, however there was lack of coordination and communication between the 2 partners So they did not finish the work planned, It was even too late to replace them with other participants as the program was already more than mid-way and many training workshops for the participants were already done.

“No begging initiative” had many activities conducted in both Irbid and Ramtha since the 4 participants who initiated this initiative were coming from both cities in the north. The four members invited the minister of social development to attend the final event in Irbid in order to support the initiative and give it a chance for sustaining it through the ministry of social development. Unfortunately, the positive answer from the minister to give patronage to this event came late and actually after the final event took place in Irbid. The four members were so enthusiastic about their initiative and willing to work on it further since the planned activities were conducted in both Irbid and Ramtha, so they asked if they could make an event in Ramtha with the minister present to be also as a final event to the community in Ramtha as they do not want to miss this opportunity of having their initiative supported even after the program ends. For this reason, JCCE opted to support them through giving them the small fund originally dedicated for the Zarqa final event which did not happen. The end result was the ministry of social development gave its full support to the initiative which was also circulated in the local media outlets.
