Rationale

Environmental Law teaching program (BA or MA) as an important subject is not offered by any law schools or universities in Cambodia. Due to limited human resources and teaching materials, any intention to establish such program is a challenge and therefore, this training series will be of great benefits to all professors and legal practitioners.

The first training on Environmental law for Professors and Legal Practitioners [TELPLP] will take place for the period of 2 days as indicated in the training program below.

Aims

- To build a basic knowledge of Environment and Ecology Concept
- To strengthen knowledge of Principles of International Environmental law and International Environmental Law Agreement
- To install knowledge on specific environmental law such as natural resource management, and climate change and adaptation
- To develop teaching skills in Environmental law
- On top of these, the training aims to build network and promote professors and experts in environmental law in Cambodia.
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Benefit and Outcomes

- 25 professors and practitioners are trained on environmental law
- Increasing awareness of environmental law knowledge and teaching to Professors and legal practitioners in Cambodia (CELA's members, Professors, lawyers, judges, students, etc.);
- Increasing capacity in teaching, research and publication among Cambodians in the field of environmental law;
- Course syllabus on special environmental laws are developed;
