

Generally, speaking, do you think that things in Israel are going in the right direction, or do you feel things are going in the wrong direction?












When thinking about the European Union, do you think of it as a unified body having relations with Israel or do you think that each individual country has its own relations with Israel?










Which country holds the current Presidency of the EU?

- 65% of age 51-60
- 65% of Ashkenazi vs. 41% of Sephardi
- 64% of secular
- 64% of those who visited Europe in last 3 years



There has been some talk that Israel could one day join the European Union. Would you support or oppose Israel joining the EU?






By Age / Gender

If you were granted citizenship from one of the EU countries would you and your family relocate to Europe?










People That Would Relocate to Europe

- 0% of Ultra-Orthodox










Have you visited Europe in the past 3 years either for business or pleasure?

Favorable Rating of Those Who Visit a Country vs. General Population



In your opinion should Germany play a greater or diminished role in the EU?










Do You Think a Larger EU Affects Israel Positively or Negatively?

Foreign Involvement in the Peace Process


The US or EU countries should be part of the Peace process and help Israel achieve Peace.	75%

If a Foreign Entity Had to be Part of the Peace Process.....










Who is Israel's Largest Trading Partner?









After Madrid and London Terror attacks in 2004 and 2005, do you think the Europeans understand Israel's security needs more or less?


