Panel Discussion: The fall of the Berlin Wall: 25 years on - 12 November 2014

Prof. Diescho of NIPAM and Hon. Huckmann, German Ambassador shared a platform to discuss the relevance and significance of the fall of the Berlin Wall 25 years on to Namibia, as well as the diplomatic relations between the two countries.

Workshop: From Incarceration to Reintegration 17-18 November 2014

The workshop will benefit from the presence of international experts and local NGO's and relevant ministries will also form part of the discussion.

The gathering will discuss broad topics that include energy security, threat to regional economic security and growth from Ebola, political developments in Africa and beyond, trends and changes in the respective member's countries.

PARLIAMENTARY CONFERENCE ON RENEWABLE ENERGY CO-SPONSORED BY KAS





On 14-15 April 2014, Konrad Adenauer Foundation co-hosted a two-day conference for the promotion of Renewable Energy (RE), and took place in the National Assembly. The goal was to elaborate on the status quo of RE in Namibia as well as to

consider problems and possible ways to overcome these problems in order to promote the use of RE in Namibia. The conference, among others, considered: The current status of the Energy Sector in Namibia, Energy options available in Namibia, the Independent Power Producer Framework: current status, success stories and challenges, experienced Renewable Energy feed-in tariffs and regional experiences and lessons from other countries. A final report was passed by Parliament in June 2014. A second energy conference was held on 11 September 2014. It discussed "Challenges for Energy Security in Namibia and Southern Africa". "The economic growth of the country and its security depends on a stable and abundant supply of energy", said Dr. Althusmann. The conference was a resounding success.

KAS INVITES CHURCH LEADERS TO DISCUSS THEIR ROLE IN THE NAMIBIAN SOCIETY

In May 2014, the Konrad Adenauer Foundation held a breakfast meeting with several church leaders of different faiths in Namibia on the topic "What keeps society together?". This meeting was organized to discuss the role of the church in society, especially in view of the challenges the country faces, such as, gender-based violence, drugs and alcohol abuse, rape and high unemployment rate. Since Independence, the churches have been losing their voices and, for instance, the Council of Churches in Namibia (CCN), the umbrella body of churches in Namibia, has seen its role weakened with the years. The participants seemed to agree that there is a need for the churches to work with each other and engage more actively with the public. The meeting was a resounding success and serves as a new starting point for the cooperation between KAS and the religious community of Namibia, further discussions are envisaged.

KAS INVITES THE PRESS TO DISCUSS 'FREEDOM OF PRESS IN NAMIBIA'

On 30 May 2014, the Konrad Adenauer Foundation invited journalists and Media Houses to discuss the freedom of press in Namibia. Given that information is a pillar of a democratic society what enables citizens to make informed decisions, such a platform was necessary. Namibia was ranked 19th country with highest press freedom in the world by Reporters Without Borders in 2013. Participants agreed that such ranking are not accurate and can be misleading. Access to information and training in investigative journalism were identified, among others, as areas needing more attention. The meeting ended positively.

As a follow-up on this meeting, on 25 June, KAS invited the press to a presentation on the KAS MEDIA Programme at Safari Hotel. The KAS Media Programme is based in Johannesburg and offers the following opportunities: Scholarships, training, networking and offer expertise on media issues.

KAS INVITES PARTY LEADERS TO DEBATE ABOUT NAMIBIA'S FUTURE

In March and June 2014, the Konrad Adenauer Foundation organized - for the first time in Namibia's history – two public debates with representatives of Namibia's parties. In the first edition, 6 parties joined the discussion and discussed topics that included Namibia's economic performance after 25 years of independence, reconciliation among Namibians, distribution of land, corruption. The party leaders also offered possible solutions to the problems confronting the country.

In the second debate, 7 parties took part and the focus was on the "recent South African Elections: Lessons for Namibia". The party leaders were invited to lay out their agenda for the country after the national polls if their party were to (re-)gain power after the elections on 28 November 2014. KAS HELD SOCIAL MEDIA WORKSHOP WITH VARIOUS PARTIES

From 23rd until 25th June, KAS hosted a Social Media workshop with expert Christian Echle from the KAS Media Programme in Johannesburg, at the Safari Hotel. For two days members of DTA and RDP learnt more about the use of social media, such as Facebook and Twitter, in electoral campaigns. Another issue was the implementation of a web TV channel for the parties. Finally a concept for the new website of the DTA was discussed. The participants were exposed to modern challenges and opportunities offered by the social media and how to capitalise on them. The expert also conducted practical training in order to test and adopt the newly gained theoretical skills. The three days social media workshop offered interesting ideas and stimulation. The participants are now challenged to implement what they have learned.

PANEL DISCUSSION ON CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

On 7 June, at Goethe Institute, KAS hosted a panel discussion with the Chairman of Law Reform and Development Commission (LRDC), Mr. Sacky Shanghala. The discussion titled "Constitutional Amendments: Challenge for Namibia? What is proposed and what do they mean?" attracted a lot of public attention and interests. The discussion was rich, informative, technical as well as controversial with people expressing their protest for not being properly consulted. In the meantime, a new movement under the umbrella "My constitution, My Decision" consisting mainly of NGO's had been set up campaigning for the withdrawal of the Amendment Bill. On Wednesday, 27 August 2014, Parliament passed the constitutional amendments. The amendments were gazetted on Monday, 13 October 2014.



On 5 September 2014, the Konrad Adenauer Foundation and the Trade Law Centre for Southern Africa (TRALAC) jointly organized a workshop of experts to look at developments within the Southern African Customs Union (SACU). The workshop benefitted from the expertise of Trudi Harzenberg, Executive Director, TRALAC, Paul Kalenga, TRALAC Associate and Prof. Gerhard Erasmus, TRALAC Associate and professor of Law at Stellenbosch University. Presenters critically analysed the 2002 SACU agreement and the status quo, the issues and challenges confronting SACU and what the future holds. A lively discussion ensued from the participants on broad range of issues confronting the world oldest customs union. Participants came from the private sectors, government departments, civil society organisations, the diplomatic community and the SACU Secretariat based in Windhoek. The workshop was a resounding success and participants greatly thanked the organizers for the initiative. A short report is available on request.

NEFF: NEW KID ON THE BLOCK



In June 2014, a new political party called the Namibia Economic Freedom Fighters (NEFF) was launched. The party is headed by Epafras Mukwiilongo, a former Swapo and COD member who referred to himself as "Commander in Chief". The party stand for the following values: It is against homosexuality and foreign exploitation of the country's natural resources, and proposes that the country's natural resources should be owned by the indigenous people. The party has registered with the ECN and is taking part in the upcoming General and Presidential Elections scheduled for 28 November 2014.



NEW LEADERSHIP AT NUDO



Following the death of its president Hon. Kuaima Riruako in June 2014, NUDO has announced its new leadership following the National Executive meeting held recently. The party has elected Mr. Asser Mbai, vice president to replace Hon. Riruako as president of the party. The party resolved to send Mr. Addy Riruako, who was next on its 2009 National Assembly list of candidates to Parliament. In the meantime, Mr. Josef Kauandenge has rejoined NUDO.

RP ENDORSES DR. HAGE GEINGOB AS ITS PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE



Following its elective Congress held on 12 July 2014, the Republican Party (RP) announced that it will support Swapo's presidential candidate, Dr. Geingob during the upcoming National Elections in November 2014. However, Mr. Mudge, the re-elected party's president, insisted on making clear that the support was entirely to Dr. Geingob as a person and not to SWAPO and should SWAPO decide to change its candidate, they would reconsider their endorsement. Mr. Mudge said "We are not supporting a Swapo candidate. We are supporting Hage. If for any reason he is not the presidential candidate, we will withdraw our support, Mudge told the Namibian Sun". Mr. Mudge has made a u-turn and withdrew his endorsement of Hage. He is now standing as a presidential candidate for his party.

The Swapo party held its electoral college on 30 August 2014 in Windhoek. The Electoral College is a meeting where the party draws up the list of candidates expected to represent it in the National Assembly. The announcement of the party's parliamentary list contains surprises with many of the so called 'trusted cadres' not making it high on the list. This has caused concern and unhappiness within the party as widely reported in the media. However, the party maintained that it was satisfied with the 'pot' outcome.

EU-KAS-WAD PROJECT CONCLUDES

The EU-KAS sponsored project implemented by Women's Action for Development (WAD) called "My Rights as a Women and Namibian Citizen! Gender and Human Rights Awareness Raising" has successfully concluded on 31 July 2014. The project launched 3 years ago with an estimated budget of N\$6 million, had as its main goal to contribute to a gender sensitive Namibian society where human rights are respected and women enjoy equal opportunities. The project trained more than 20 000 Namibians in all 14 regions. It received support from the Ministry of Gender Equality and Child Welfare (MGECW), the Legal Assistance Centre (LAC) and UNAM Law Faculty.










