OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC PROTECTOR (PP)

NEW PARTNERSHIP PLANNED FOR 2016

Since the first round of discussions between Thomas Heilman (CDU), Senator for Justice and consumer Protection in Berlin, and the Public Protector (PP), Thuli Madonsela on the role of the state ombudsman in the context of constitutional power, there has been renewed talks between the KAS country office and the PP. It was agreed upon



that 2016 will see more collaboration between KAS and the PP in terms of training and development in the area of procurement law. The African Public Procurement Regulation Research Unit (APPRRU) at the University of Stellenbosch (Professor Geo Quinot) will join us in this project. In addition to this, the possibility of collaborating on the annual Good Governance conference of the Public Protectors will be considered.

STUDY AND DIALOGUE PROGRAMME FOR REPRESENATIVES OF EMPLOYERS, ACADEMIA AND CIVIL SOCIETY IN ERFURT AND BERLIN

COUNTRY PROGRAMME 2015

In May 2015, the Konrad-Adenauer-Foundation invited a delegation of South African representatives from government, business, academia and civil society organizations to Erfurt and Berlin, to discuss the question of strengthening social partnerships in South Africa, so that all stake-holders affected by decisions can

AFRICAN SWING STATES - DRIVERS OF DEVELOPMENT?

CONFERENCE ON THE CATALYTIC ROLE OF NIGERIA, KENYA AND SOUTH AFRICA

KAS in cooperation with the Brenthurst Foundation organized a conference from 16 – 19 August 2015 at Lake Como in Italy to discuss the significance of the so called swing states South Africa, Nigeria and Kenya for the political and economic development for other African countries. The goal of this expert meeting, attended by 30 high ranked representatives from



South Africa, Nigeria, Kenya and the African Union, was to bring about a dynamic exchange of ideas to conceive solutions and strategies for future African challenges. After an exchange of views on the political, societal and economic challenges and cooperation between the swing states, the systemic impact of these countries on their neighboring countries was discussed. It was agreed that increased cooperation between African states could be beneficial for the whole of Africa, and that the swing states could take the lead in promoting this. In doing so, the promotion of social cohesion, amongst other things, must be considered, as it has become an obstacle to development in all the mentioned swing states.

TILMANN FELTES: THE NEW KAS-PROJECT MANAGER PRESENTS HIMSELF

In October 2015, after a six month training period in Berlin, we were happy to welcome our new project manager, Mr Tilmann Feltes, to our country office in Johannesburg. Prior to his post with KAS, Mr Feltes worked for our partner organization - the Democracy Development Programme (DDP) in Durban where he was responsible for the establishment of a youth network for the promotion of democracy in South Africa.

Mr. Feltes gained further practical experience as a researcher with the Arnold-Bergstraesser-Institute in Freiburg, for which he conducted intensive fieldwork in the Republic of Kosovo. Furthermore, he has worked with GIZ in Germany and abroad,



as well as with the Christian charity organisation Fe y Alegría in the Republic of Venezuela.

With an M.A. in Political Science and a B.A. in Human Geography from the universities of Freiburg, Bochum und Dundee, Mr. Feltes has concentrated extensively on International Relations and Politics. With his Masters thesis he focused on the democratization efforts of the international community in Kosovo with particular focus on the promotion of youth. He had an opportunity to pursue his academic interest in the intersection between politics and sustainable development by lecturing and studying towards his PhD in the area of sustainable urban development at the Urban Futures Centre at Durban University of Technology (DUT).
