Characteristics of the SPF




- Are short-term (max 1 year) but high-impact projects;
- contribute towards a multi-stakeholder dialogue on strategic issues
 of economic development and governance;
- are likely to produce an impact at policy level and to offer models for best practice;
- create links between the Philippines and the EU, and serve the mutual interests of both partners.

Commitment: 2,6 Million Euros, over 2 years

Priority areas for 2005



- 1) EU-Philippines economic relations
- Philippine exports to Europe: enhancing competitiveness, developing niche markets;
- •Assistance to help comply with EU requirements particularly food safety requirements; good manufacturing practices: hygiene, consumer protection;
- •EU Enlargement: Opportunities and challenges for trade, investment and finance;
- •Enhancing competitiveness of the Philippines for European investment;
- Promoting investment in non-metropolitan areas;
- •Implementing the Philippine Export Development Plan, with focus on access to European markets;
- Improving the investment climate for EU Foreign Direct Investment;
- •Tapping EU best practice in economic regulations/economic governance (examples: competition policy, consumer safety).





- 2) Corporate governance
- Corporate social, environmental responsibility;
- Support to Corporate watchgroups;
- Promoting financial transparency in private corporations





- 3) Good governance
- Promoting transparency in local and central government; monitoring of public expenditure;
- Participatory planning in LGUs (ex.: land use plans; development plans, etc);
- •ICT for Good Governance: implementing policies, scaling up and disseminating best practices (ex: e-procurement, GIS for planning and management, etc);
- Support to fight against graft and corruption;
- •Millennium Development Goals monitoring mechanisms in Local Governments;
- Public finance reforms.

Priority will be given to proposals which focus on the themes listed above.

Revenues producing activities, including feasibility studies and market research, which are the normal prelude to commercial ventures.














EC contribution ranges between 3.5 million and 17 million PHP
