

## KAS Amman Library: On Top of Progress in the Information Society

Last year Gerrit was studying for his exams at the oldest German library at the University of Heidelberg. After graduation he moved to the Middle East, in the "name of knowledge". Through this change, the former student of political science was transformed into Mr. Gerrit F. Schlomach M.A., the scientific assistant at the Konrad Adenauer Foundation (KAS) Regional Office in Amman.

His mission: Books! His objective: To develop a multilingual library as an open space of knowledge in Jordan. After the combined efforts of all participating forces<sup>1</sup> and the deployment of WinISIS 1.5, the first step of the mission was completed at the beginning of 2006. As a result, more than 1,000 documented sources were reported to the Konrad Adenauer Foundation Headquarters in Berlin.

## The success story of "Mission in Books", Amman

At the heart of the KAS Amman Library is the WinISIS 1.5<sup>2</sup> software distributed by UNESCO for free and described as follows: "a menu-driven generalized Information Storage and Retrieval system designed specifically for the computerized management of structured non-numerical data bases." Behind this cryptic description you find simple database software which can handle all kinds of information in a self-designed manner.

When the Regional Office in Amman started searching for appropriate software<sup>3</sup> not only were the issues of functionality and information retrieval important, but so was the multilingual application. In all three areas WinISIS proved convincing results. The UNESCO office in Paris distributes the software for free in

English, French and Spanish. To have access to the software you only need to fill out the online registration form - that's all. Thanks to the support of UNESCO, there are now versions in all kinds of different languages available, like Arabic, Chinese or Korean. German users can find on the CDS/ISIS Netzwerk e.V.<sup>4</sup> website an appropriate user interface as well as German documentation. The software user is free to change the language of the user interface whenever he wants. The functions of the software include all the features you need for data processing. However, it has to be mentioned that it takes some time to understand all the functions and to use the software in an appropriate way, because you are free to follow your individual desires and needs at all times.

In order to organize the library, the KAS Regional Office developed a systematization based on the leading ordering systems: the Dewey Decinal System<sup>5</sup> and the Library of Congress Classification<sup>6</sup>. Our alphanumeric system includes three layers, 11 main levels from A (as in Allgemeines [Generals]) to Z (as in Zeitschriften [Journals]). Before we started labelling the books, we kept in mind the local landscape of libraries in Jordan and tried to be more user-friendly. However, what is the best classification worth when you don't have keywords to find a source easily? Once more the KAS Regional Office in Amman found a satisfactory solution through the websites of UNESCO<sup>7</sup>. The UNESCO Thesaurus, used as the ground of the UNESCO Computerized Documentation System (CDS), contains an index in English, Spanish and French with more than 6,600 keywords. Although you can buy the thesaurus from UNESCO, there is ample information and documentation sources available online<sup>8</sup>. However, practice makes perfect in using keywords in order to guarantee a fully successful mission in books.
