Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development; Federal Foreign Office

**International Dialogue Programs (IP)** 

Guidelines of the Federal Foreign Office about the funding, support, and follow-up support for foreign students, interns, graduate students, and academics (Scholarship Guidelines)

**European and International Cooperation (EIZ) -**

Multiple levels (written and oral): Recommendation from KAS Representative at foreign office, submission of required documents (please see the information sheet) by the KAS Representative at the foreign office to the responsible IP Coordinator (by region)

Spring semester: by December 15th of the previous year (cut-off date) Fall semester: by July 15th of the same calendar year (cut-off date)

approx. 80 scholarships per year

**Application** Procedure

Multiple levels (written and oral): Recipients chosen via annual Selection Conferences ("Auswahltage" or AWT) hosted by KAS foreign offices (locations chosen by EIZ and BK), as well as in Germany (annually in autumn)

Deadlines

Deadlines chosen in agreement with EIZ and the relevant KAS foreign offices, for Germany always by July 15th

approx. 300 scholarships per year

above-average political or social engagement desired

not required

no age restrictions

1 semester for studies (6 months); the duration of funding can be shorter in the case of internships or research stays

the maximum duration of funding is 2 years for studies, 6 months for internships or research stays, and 12 months for fellowships

## **Offerings**

Consultation and Support

via the Department "Scholarship Program for International Students" of BK, local university groups and tutors/liaison professors at university (approx. 180 groups in Germany and Europe), and the Network of International Scholars (NIS)

**Financial Support** 

850 Euro for master's students/1,200 Euro for PhD candidates per month, refund of health insurance payments, round-trip travel from home country to Germany; where applicable rent subsidy, lump sum reimbursement of additional costs (rent-related and to be paid at the end of the year), additional benefits for research trips, German courses, and spouse/children

KAS-Network Support

Obligatory attendance of the seminar and workshop programs provided by the local university group and BK; joint seminars with EIZ ("Bridge" Seminar and Meeting of the NIS)

is a primary goal of the scholarship program, hence

Integration in Germany

max. 6 months of German courses fundable

the prerequisite knowledge of German

Language Courses Alumni Support

via the Club of Former Scholarship Holders, ASeV and KASConnect, as well as various KAS foreign offices

primarily via the Coordinators of the IP Department, inclusion in local university groups will be further strengthened, as well as enhanced contact for scholars to the relevant EIZ Regional Department

850 Euro for master's students/1,200 Euro for PhD candidates per month, refund of health insurance payments, round-trip travel from home country to Germany; where applicable rent subsidy, lump sum reimbursement of additional costs (rent-related and to be paid annually), additional benefits for research trips, German courses, and spouse/children

Welcome Seminar in the fall semester for new scholarship recipients, "Bridge" Seminar with the applicable EIZ Regional Department and BK in the spring semester (for all scholars), KAS events as available in the scholar's location of residence

Emphasis on the return to the scholar's home country and the application of gained knowledge in the support of KAS projects on-site

max. 6 months of German courses fundable

via the KAS foreign offices and regional "Follow-up Seminars" (2 per year), inclusion in the EIZ Former Scholars Group in KASConnect, and regional networks should be further supported
