What role for the Alliance in a new era?

29 April 2020, via Zoom

At the upcoming NATO Summit, the Alliance has a historic opportunity to open a new chapter in its over 70 years of partnership. NATO faces a significantly changing security environment and shifting priorities of its member states. At the last summit in 2019, NATO members thus decided to initiate a forward-looking reflection process lead by Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg. Labelled 'NATO 2030', this initiative has led to extensive consultations and an in-depth review that yielded a number of strategic level proposals. These propositions outline how the Alliance should adapt to remain strong militarily, to become stronger politically, and to take a more global approach. The results of the 'NATO 2030' process were presented to member states in view of the upcoming NATO Summit in June 2021, when the Alliance is expected to initiate an update of its over ten-year-old Strategic Concept. We would like to discuss with key actors of the 'NATO 2030' process, how the NATO must adapt, which priorities to set and how the proposals can be implemented.
