South African Reconciliation Barometer

“A majority of respondents identified the gap between rich and poor as the most divisive aspect of society, which continues to keep us apart.” – SARB 2015

The SA Reconciliation Barometer (SARB) Survey is the only South African public opinion survey of its kind that measures public opinion on national unity reconciliation. The survey was conducted amongst a nationally representative sample of South Africans during August and September 2015.

At the start of a local government election year where South Africans feel financially pressured and racially polarised, the IJR, with the support of the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung, will release more of its key findings related to how South Africans view their own living conditions and economic wellbeing.
