- 2. However, @ 21, we expect maturity in climate governance
- 3. Africa remains a dark continent in terms of energy security
- 4. There is **no** climate policy or strategy for Southern Africa SADC
- 5. Gaps in national CC policies and governance with countries at different levels
- 6. Big brother fear of dominance in regional CC governance by **South Africa**, looked at with suspicion
- 7. Strong push for adaptation (inclusive of L&D) than mitigation
- 8. Traditional challenges on CC equity going back to basics of the Rio (polluter pays) and UNFCCC (common but differentiated responsibilities and capabilities)
- 9. Cop 21 has the good (we have a deal), the bad (deal quasi legally binding need to avoid another KP) and the ugly (promised money comes in trickles)
- 10. Need to be careful of the **half a loaf** is better than nothing disease see World Bank and other divisive climate funding
- 11. Can Southern Africa make powerful nations accountable? No
- 12. None CC matters with a CC governance bearing eg Xenophobic attacks, when should long serving leaders go?
- 13. We have the colonial baggage Anglo, Franco and Portuguese ell wants.

 France hosted its own Africa pavilion compared to Uneca's pavilion on Paris
- 14. Deal breakers: No agriculture, No mining, NO DEAL now and into the future
- 15. Climate governance requires well-oiled good governance machineries in SADC
- 16. Value chains, value addition, localization of technologies and the land issue
- 17.A call to avoid having the new climate deal as a non-tariff barrier
- 18. Need to watch for Group of 2 in climate negotiations (China & USA)
- 19. Challenges with local government and CC
