Prof. Christi van der Westhuizen (Ph.D.) is an author, political analyst, academic and former journalist. Her books include *Sitting Pretty: White Afrikaans Women in Postapartheid South Africa* (forthcoming, 2017), *Working Democracy: Perspectives on South Africa's Parliament at 20 Years* (2014) and *White Power & the Rise and Fall of the National Party* (2007).

She started her working life at the anti-apartheid weekly *Vrye Weekblad* and later worked as Associate Editor at the global news agency Inter Press Service. Her columns and articles have appeared in the *Sunday Times, The Star, Cape Times, Mail & Guardian, Beeld, die Burger* and Netwerk24, and she is a regular on radio.
