Jan Hofmeyr is a political analyst, with extensive experience in the implementation of quantitative and qualitative diagnostic tools in the spheres of political- and economic governance in transitional societies across Africa and further abroad. As Senior Programme Head: Research and Policy at the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR), Africa's leading think tank in the field of transitional justice, he forms part of the organisation's core management team, and also serves on the executive committee of the Afrobarometer Network, Africa's most authoritative continental public opinion research project into democracy and governance issues. His work experience covers the thematic fields of democratisation, governance reform, peacebuilding,

transitional justice, and political economy, and he has led or participated in the execution of projects in these fields, in collaboration with major international donors and multilateral organisations. He forms part of the Bertelsmann Foundation's Transformation Thinkers Network, as well as the GIZ's Global Leadership Academy Fellows Network.
