Europe-Africa: Challenges and Opportunities of Migration Flows

Migration flow is driven by a number of factors including conflict, economic opportunities, natural disasters and environmental factors. African countries are both countries of origin (e.g. Somalia with more than 1 million refugees abroad) as well as countries of destination. Whereas, Africa is the origin of large intercontinental migration flows to Europe, the Americas and the Arab region; still most of Sub-Saharan migrants stay in other Sub-Saharan countries. Southern Africa is attracting high volumes of migration due to work opportunities in mining, manufacturing and agricultural industries and has the function of a "springboard" for migration to Europe and the Americas.

It is paramount to have cooperation between countries of origin, of transit and of destination to manage migration flows.

H.E Michael Gahler, Chair of the European Parliament delegation for relations with the Pan-African Parliament, will deliver a keynote address on Migration Policies and the Relations between Africa and Europe.

The speakers are Members of the European and Pan African Parliament, Department of Home Affairs as well as experts from civil society organizations like UNHCR, IOM, and SAI-IA. Discussions will focus on Mixed Migration in Africa, Managing Migration in Receiving Countries and it will also propose solutions to deal with Intra-Regional and InterContinental Migration.
