About the SARB

Since 2003, the South African Reconciliation Barometer (SARB) – conducted by the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR) - has conducted 15 rounds of the survey. The SARB provides a nationally representative measure of South Africans' perceptions and experiences of reconciliation and social cohesion related matters. SARB's unique data have now been made more easily accessible and visual through a publically available online analysis tool.

About Afrobarometer

Afrobarometer is a Pan-African, non-partisan research network that conducts public attitude surveys on democracy, governance, economic conditions, and related issues in African countries. Six rounds of surveys were conducted in up to 37 countries between 1999 and 2015, and Round 7 surveys are being completed in 2018. Afrobarometer conducts face-to-face interviews in the language of the respondent's choice with nationally representative samples.
