# **Analysing Counterterrorism Efforts on an International** and European Level

## Concept

The aim of the conference is to shed light on recent developments of research in the field of International Relations and concrete policy recommendations to decision-makers concerning asymmetric warfare, terrorism, and radicalization both globally and on a European level.

More than 50 years of experience has accumulated in the field of terrorism studies since the deadly year of 1967, and 15 years have already passed since the collapse of the twin towers in New York City. A lot of previous research and many conclusions are still valid and relevant today, especially with regard to the European member-states.

After the opening ceremony, the speakers will discuss topics from two different but interconnected perspectives to identify their most important aspects. The roundtable discussion will be divided into two panels, each with a different moderator. The topics of the panels are related to the counter-terrorism and radicalization.

#### First Panel: Counterterrorism - Methods and Practices

Experts will examine the major aspects of international terrorism, such as tactics and social phenomena. Speakers such as Mark M. Lowenthal have first-hand experience in decision-making in the field of counterterrorism. Meanwhile, Marie-Helen Maras, author of the book "Counterterrorism" and Alfred Rolington, author of the book "Strategic Intelligence for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century", are both distinguished experts of issues related to intelligence services.

## Second Panel: Radicalisation in the European Union and its Neighbourhood

Speakers will examine radicalization of young ethnic groups in European societies from the viewpoint of sociology, psychology, and political science. Thus, the aim of the discussion is to seek answers to the questions of counter-terrorism with the help of theoretical methods as well as practical intelligence approaches.
