



## Call for Papers: The Arab Journal of Constitutional Law

The Arab Journal of Constitutional Law (AJCL) is a double-blind peer-reviewed journal launched in partnership between the Arab Association of Constitutional Law (AACL) and the Rule of Law Programme Middle East/North Africa of Konrad Adenauer Stiftung (KAS). The journal is a venue for scholarly analysis on issues related to constitutions and constitutional law throughout the MENA region. The AJCL's objective is to improve access to information, encourage greater discussion about constitutional and legal developments in the region and to increase debate about these developments amongst the international community of practitioners and scholars.

The Editorial Board is pleased to invite submissions for its first edition of the Arab Journal of Constitutional Law, which will be published online in May 2019. The Editorial Board warmly welcomes submissions of papers, in English, on themes related to constitutional law and constitutional legal developments in the MENA region. **Successfully published authors will receive an incentive fee of \$250 for their paper.**

**Please note that the deadline for all submissions is the 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2019.**

### Submission Instructions

1. AJCL uses online submissions only. Both Windows and Mac users are requested to save the source file of their manuscript with the extension: (.doc). Authors should submit their manuscripts to the following email address [Journal.contact@dustour.org](mailto:Journal.contact@dustour.org), with the subject line "Submission of a Contribution to AJCL First Edition". Within the body of the email, authors are required to submit the following:
  - Author's full name;
  - Author's credentials and affiliations;
  - Publication title;
  - Pasted copy of their abstract.
2. Manuscripts can be submitted in United States English, and the text should be grammatically sound. In quoted material, leave spelling unchanged except in the case of obvious error. Manuscripts must follow the conventions of the *Chicago Manual of Style* (16th edition 2010).
3. The desired manuscript length is 10,000 to 14,000 words.
4. Manuscript submissions should include an abstract of roughly 150 words that clearly defines the article, and 5-10 keywords.
5. Use only one font throughout the text.



## Submission Guidelines

Authors must ensure that their manuscripts are prepared in a way that does not give away their identity directly or indirectly. To facilitate this, authors are required to submit two separate files, a Title Page and a Blinded Manuscript. To help with this preparation please ensure the following when submitting:

- A. **Title Page:** the title page will remain separate from the manuscript throughout the peer review process and will not be sent to the reviewers.
  - The manuscript title
  - All authors' names and affiliations
  - A complete address for the corresponding author, including an e-mail address
  - Acknowledgements
- B. **Anonymized Manuscripts:** please note that all manuscripts must be anonymized, please remove any identifying information, such as authors' names or affiliations, from your manuscript before submission. For further information on how to anonymize manuscripts, please refer to the [AJCL Editorial Guidelines](#).
- C. **Footnotes and Citations:** Footnotes must conform to the 19th edition of the *Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*. Footnotes should be limited to citations wherever possible; long, discursive footnotes are strongly discouraged. Please refer to the [AJCL Editorial Guidelines](#) for detailed information and examples.

## Production and Consent to Publish

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to each author by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs and communicate them to the Editor via the following email address [Journal.contact@dustour.org](mailto:Journal.contact@dustour.org). By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose the author needs to sign the Consent to Publish, which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.
