Anja Czymmeck



Anja Czymmeck has a master's degree in Linguistics and Geography from the University of Bonn and was scientific assistant to members of the North Rhine-Westphalia Parliament and the European Parliament (Brussels and Strasbourg). Subsequently, from 1998, she held different positions at the Konrad Adenauer Foundation headquarters in Berlin, as well as in other countries, such as: project assistant in Venezuela, Desk Officer of

the Latin America team, head of KAS offices in Fortaleza / Brazil and North-Macedonia and Kosovo. From January 2015 to April 2016, she was Desk Officer of the foundation's projects in Western, Southeast, Northern Europe and in the Andean Regions. Current Position since August 2019: Director of KAS Brazil Office in Rio de Janeiro.

José Pio Borges



Jose Pio Borges has served as President of the Brazilian National Bank for Economic and Social Development (BNDES). He was also CEO of Pronor Petroquímica and Managing Director at BBM Bank. Currently, he is member of the Board of Directors of Captalys Investments, and of the Strategic Board of Casa Firjan. He has also served in the Board of Petrobras, Cia Vale do Rio Doce, Aracruz Celulose SA, among many others. He is director at the Stefan Zweig House in

Petrópolis and Chairman of the Board of the Eva Klabin Foundation, among others.

Ignacio Ybáñez



Ignacio Ybáñez is Ambassador of the European Union to Brazil. He is a Spanish Diplomat and was Secretary of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of his country, where he also held the position of Director-General for Foreign Policy and Multilateral Global Affairs and Director-General of Africa, the Mediterranean and the Middle East. In addition, he was Spanish Ambassador to Russia.

Fernando Azevedo e Silva



Fernando Azevedo e Silva is the Brazilian Defense Minister since January 2019. Retired Army General, he was promoted to his last commission in 2014. In his military career, besides attending all the regular officers' courses, he specialized as Army Pathfinder. He commanded the Brazilian Airborne Infantry Brigade and the Brazilian Army Physical Fitness Centre. In 2013 and 2014, he presided the Olympic Public Authority. As East Military Commander, he coordinated

the area defense during the Rio 2016 Olympics. In the following year, he took charge of the Brazilian Army General Staff. His last function, before being nominated Defense Minister, was Special Adviser to the Brazilian Federal Supreme Court President.

David McAllister



David McAllister was elected as a member of the State Parliament of Niedersachsen (Lower Saxony) in 1998. From 2003 to 2010 he served as Chairman of the Christian Democratic Union (CDU) Group and from 2010 until 2013 as Prime Minister of Niedersachsen. Since 2014 he is a Member of the European Parliament and is Vice President of the European People's Party (EPP). He chairs the Committee on Foreign Affairs in the European Parliament and also

the UK Coordination Group.

Lieutenant General Ary Soares Mesquita joined the Air Force in 1984. Main positions: 26th Airlift Squadron Commander, Salvador Air Base Commander, Aeronautical Attaché at the Brazilian Embassy in South Africa, head of the Aeronautical Social Communication Center and ALA 1 Commander. Current position: Secretary of Defense and National Security.

Henning Speck



Henning Speck serves as a National Security Advisor to the CDU/CSU Parliamentary Group in the German Bundestag, giving counsel and advice to all members of the Conservative Caucus in Germany's Federal Parliament on the vast range of foreign and security policy topics. Mr. Speck is a career diplomat in the German Foreign Service who held various positions in the Foreign Ministry, Federal Chancellery and the German Embassies in Kabul and Washington.

Elena Lazarou



Dr. Lazarou is Policy Analyst at the European Parliamentary Research Service (EPRS), where her research focuses on security and defence, global governance, transatlantic relations and EU foreign policy. Prior to joining EPRS, she was assistant professor and Head of the Center for International Relations of the Getulio Vargas Foundation (FGV), Brazil. She received a Ph.D. in International Relations from the University of Cambridge in 2008. She has held research positions at the University of Cambridge, the

University of Sheffield and the London School of Economics (LSE). She is also an Associate Fellow on the "US and Americas" programme at Chatham House.

Antonio Jorge Ramalho da Rocha



Antonio Jorge Ramalho da Rocha, PhD, is associate professor of the Institute of International Relations at the University of Brasilia. His professional career includes experiences at the Ministries of Defense, Foreign Affairs and Education, and at the Secretariat for Strategic Affairs of the Presidency.
