Chadema advises people to conserve the environment

All people must be responsible for conserving the environment, rather than leaving the duty to the government and leaders only.

This was said by the Chama cha Demokrasia na Maendeleo (Chadema) secretary general, Dr Willibrod Slaa, in Dar es Salaam yesterday when he inaugurated a day's workshop on climate change. He said in order for the country to win the crusade against climate change which has been affecting the economy, every 'mwananchi' regardless of his/her position or political affiliation needs to be proactive.

Yesterday's workshop was organised by Chadema in collaboration with a German organisation called Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung foundation. "We need to leave politics when it comes to important issues like climate change.
