Henning Glaser, born 1971, is the director of the German-Southeast Asian Center of Excellence for Public Policy and Good Governance (CPG), at the Faculty of Law, Thammasat University. Henning Glaser's research areas include governance and compliance studies, as a consultant he is serving numerous governmental and nongovernmental agencies in Europe, America and Asia in various fields of law and governance including the National Human Rights Commission of Thailand by which he was appointed as an expert in 2016.

Having studied law at Münster University he worked as a civil servant lawyer at the higher regional court in Hamm until he passed the second state exam qualifying for the judicial service. From 1999 to the end of 2004, he was assistant professor at the University of Münster where he also served as managing director of the "Society for the Promotion of the Faculty of Law on the University of Münster e.V." Additionally, between 1997 and 2004, he worked as a consultant for clients operating in South East Asia and acted as a managing director of a registered trading and consulting company (since 1999). In 2005 he founded his law office in Münster.

Since 2007 he has been teaching German and comparative constitutional law as well as Thai public law at the Faculty of Law of Thammasat University where he became the founding director of CPG in 2009.
