

Mayor Isko: Pandemic response



- Deployment of e-trikes for health workers and front-liners
- Disinfection of bus terminals and tight screening of passengers
- Setting up of the Manila Infectious Disease Control Center within a week of the ECQ declaration
- Manila established the country's only COVID field hospital, located at Rizal Park, for moderate to severe cases. 16 quarantine facilities were built that prepared the city for the case surge last March 2021.
- The city ordered advanced hospital equipment to expand the capacity of intensive care units.
- The city government has established two swab laboratories and beefed up its equipment.

Mayor Isko: Pandemic response

- When the World Health Organization and the Department of Health approved Tocilizumab, an immunosuppressive drug, and Remdesivir, an antiviral medicine, Moreno promptly placed orders for the city's COVID-19 patients.
- Manila signed a tripartite agreement for the procurement of Astra Zeneca vaccine.
- The city set up its own storage facilities for the vaccines.
- As of September 2021, 95 percent of Manileños have gotten their first COVID-19 vaccine dose, while 68.96 percent are fully vaccinated.
- Over the past six months, some 700,000 families received monthly food boxes to cushion the economic impact of the pandemic restrictions.







OVP SET TO OPEN 2 MORE DORMITORIES IN MANILA FOR COVID-19 FRONTLINERS

The Office of the Vice President Leni Robredo will open two more free dermitories in Manila for frontliners in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.

- "I am today announcing my intention to run for the Presidency of the Philippines in the upcoming May 2022 elections. I will bring that form of unifying leadership back to our country. Join me in this noblest of causes and we will succeed. Sama-sama tayong babangon muli," Marcos said.
- "Hangad kong ibalik ang mapagkaisang paglilingkod na magbubuklod sa ating bansa. Tayo'y magkaisa at sama-sama tayong babangon mula sa hagupit ng pandemya, babangon mula sa paglulugmok ng ating ekonomiya," he added.



Mayor Isko

- "I may not give you a perfect government, but together we can make it better," Moreno said, as he announced his bid for the top job
- "It is not a crime to wear threadbare clothes because of poverty. What is wrong is to praise an emperor's clothes when in fact he is wearing none," he said in a mix of Tagalog and English.
- "Yes, I grew up being poor. But I have never been bad-mannered. Although I've lived in the trash, not once did I become foul-mouthed," he said, while taking a swipe at the alleged corruption in the Duterte administration's purchase of medical equipment during the pandemic.



VP Leni

- "Naniniwala ako ang pag-ibig nasusukat hindi lang sa pagtitiis, kundi sa kahandaang lumaban, kahit gaano kahirap, para matapos na ang pagtitiis. Ang nagmamahal, kailangangang ipaglaban ang minamahal," Robredo said.
- "Buong buo ang loob ko ngayon. Kailangan nating palayain ang sarili mula sa kasalukuyang sitwasyon. Lalaban ako. Lalaban tayo. Inihahain ko ang aking sarili bilang kandito sa pagkapangulo sa halalan ng 2022," she said.
- Pero hindi kayang tabunan ng kahit anumang ingay ang katotohanan. Kung parehong uri ng pamamahala at pareho ang pagkatao ng mga magwawagi sa araw ng halalan, wala tayong aasahang pagbabago. Dito tayo po-posisyon," she claimed.



Sen. Manny

- In his acceptance speech, he called for political corruption in the country to end. He said all corrupt politicians "will soon end in jail together."
- "We need progress. We need to win against poverty. We need government to serve our people with integrity, compassion and transparency," Pacquiao said. "We gave you a chance, but you failed us. We waited for a long time, decades have passed, but nothing happened."
- "I am a fighter, and I will always be a fighter inside and outside the ring. In my whole life, I have not backed out of a fight. Because in the name of principle, the nation's pride, I stand reaffirmed and strong," he said.








Vision for the Country: Hunger, local employment and poverty are the main socioeconomic issues that should be addressed


































The construction of windmills in Bangui and Burgos towns in Ilocos Norte, are considered the poster image of the Philippines' renewable energy program.









