This podcast will feature talks with international experts from different regions of the world discussing opportunities and challenges for human rights in the digital age. The content will focus mainly on data protection issues, legal tech and the use of artificial intelligence.

The host of the podcast is Dr Angela Daly, a socio-legal scholar of digital technology.

The first guest is Frederick Richter. He is the director of the German Foundation for

Data Protection and he gives us insights on how the General Data Protection Regulation has influenced the world and the EU/Germany in particular. Stiftung Datenschutz (Foundation for Data Protection) was established by the German Federal Government in 2013. The nonprofit incorporated foundation offers a neutral forum for debates around effective and efficient data policy and develops recommendations for privacy politics.
