Foster civil society's oversight role by strengthening their collaboration with LGs to assess performance and to monitor service delivery

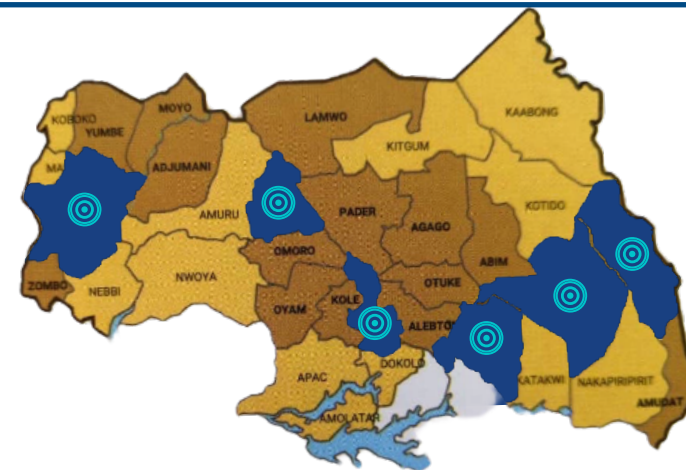
