The Annual Climate Change Law Seminar is a platform aimed at fostering regular discussion on the relevance of the Climate Change Act, 2016 of Kenya. The key objective is to assess the state of implementation of the Act with a comparative approach to initiatives by other countries in Africa, and particularly, implementation of the Paris Agreement, 2015. The 2nd Annual Climate Law Seminar, 2018, follows the tradition of the first one and will focus on climate change and litigation.
