SURVEY AHEAD OF NPP FLAGBEARER PRIMARIES SHOWS CLEAR FRONT-RUNNER AND STRONG EXPECTATIONS FOR COMPETENT, ETHICAL LEADERSHIP

The Konrad Adenauer Stiftung (KAS) Ghana has conducted an extensive survey among more than 18,000 respondents to understand expectations and preferences ahead of the January 2026 NPP Presidential Primaries. The findings highlight a strong desire for competence, experience, and development-oriented leadership, as well as clear frontrunners among potential Flagbearers.

The survey, which includes the responses of over 5,000 NPP delegates and more than 13,000 citizens (non-delegates), reflects a highly inclusive and diverse national sample with strong representation across all age groups (core ages between 26–55), across urban, peri-urban, and rural areas (41% rural), different educational and employment backgrounds, religions (Christian 74%, Muslim 22%) and across all ethnic groups. These demographics ensure that the results reflect the views of a wide cross-section of Ghanaian society. Data collection took place between 15th Nov and 10th Dec 2025.

KEY FINDINGS:

1.What qualities and strengths do citizens (delegates and non-delegates) want to see in the next NPP flagbearer?

Across all respondents, the top expectations are: **Competence** (largest factor at 24.9%), **Experience** (20.3%), **Vision** (16.9%), **Accessibility** (also at the grassroot level) (14.1%) and **Charisma** (8.5%). **Identity factors such as age, gender, religion, or tribe collectively account for less than 1% of responses.**

2. Which personalities possess the required leadership qualities?

<u>Delegates:</u> Dr Mahamudu Bawumia – 69.7%; Hon. Kennedy Agyapong – 22.5%; Dr Bryan Acheampong – 6.0%; Others – <1% each
<u>Non-delegates:</u> Dr Mahamudu Bawumia – 52.9%; Hon. Kennedy Agyapong – 31.2%; Dr Bryan Acheampong – 7.9%; Others – small single digits

Across both groups, Mahamudu Bawumia is viewed as the political figure who most clearly represents the preferred leadership qualities, though Kennedy Agyapong enjoys a stronger popularity among non-delegates.



3.Who is best suited to be flagbearer?

Delegates: Dr Mahamudu Bawumia – 67.8%; Hon. Kennedy Agyapong – 21.3%; Dr Bryan Acheampong – 6.6%; Others – < 5%

Non-delegates: Dr Mahamudu Bawumia – 50.6%; Hon. Kennedy Agyapong – 29.8%;

Dr Bryan Acheampong – 8.7%; Others – small single digits

Delegates' preferences are decisive: Bawumia leads by a 3:1 margin, currently positioning him as the overwhelming favourite if the primaries were held today.

4.Overall interest in the primaries

84.5% of NPP delegates stated they are very interested in the upcoming primaries, while only 37% of citizens (non-delegates) say they are very interested. 91.6% of NPP delegates indicated they are likely or very likely to vote in the primaries
