

Dear Friends of KAS Canada,

We are marching at full speed here in Canada. In October, not only we have welcomed the delegation of Junge Union - largest political youth organization in Germany and Europe and attended to the Couchiching Conference organized by Canadian International Council, but also participated to Vancouver International Security Summit and Montreal International Security Summit. Key take aways from Montreal and Vancouver focused very much on countering foreign interference, strengthening cooperation between Canada and EU, as well as the complexity of the Arctic Security.

I was also pleased to record a new episode of KAS Canada Unfiltered with Dr. Mikhail Polianskii, Konrad Adenauer Visiting Scholar on Transatlantic Relations at Carleton University, focusing on hybrid warfare, Russia's invasion of Ukraine and how the new geopolitical dynamics will change the upcoming future. We are talking about the new hybrid warfare, how Putin is seeing NATO, Russia's foreign policy and what kind of threats can be counter-measured by NATO in the future.

In November, we continue to move at the fast pace by organizing the "Expanding Trans-Atlantic Energy and Mineral Supply Chains" workshop with Canadian Global Affairs Institute on 5 November in Calgary and 7 November, attending to CASIS 2025 Annual Symposium: Disorder at the Gates - Canada's Role In A Fragmenting World.

Further on, we are partnering with the Delegation of the European Union and organizing a conference "Bridging the Atlantic: Canada-EU Economic Relations- Challenges and Opportunities for CETA" on November 14 co-hosted by our foundation.

Another activity that we are engaging on during November, is "Building Disinformation Resilience: A Canada-EU Joint Workshop Countering Foreign Information Manipulation and Interference" on November 26 co-hosted by our foundation, Delegation of the European Union and University of Ottawa.

As you can see, we are very active with full staff in our office, and I am happy to announce that we are welcoming a new Accountant Administration, Mr. Vishwas Pareek to our team.

Coming to Canada and our organization, the Right Hon. Mark Carney has recently announced its outline for the Fall budget and mentioned the changing nature of Canada's trade relationship with the United States announcing that his government aims to double non-U.S. exports over the next decade.

This is an important time for Canada to collaborate with its EU partners such as Germany, and establish closer ties collaborating in domains such as research and innovation, science, economy and cultural areas.

As winter time is approaching, we are happy to almost close a year with you all and appreciate your interest in our organization.

- KAS has also attended and moderated a panel on Transatlantic Security in the Vancouver International Security Summit, taking place on 17 October.
















Upcoming Events
